Louisville Ky June 6th 1847

My Dear Sir

I was much pleased at receiving your letter the other day, inquiring after my health &c, and would cheerfully inform you that I am doing very well and for the first time begin to think, I will once more become sound & hearty. The Doctor in whom I have placed every confidence, thinks in about two weeks I may start for home. I have paid my expenses since I have been here, with my Paint Brush, so the cost does not come so heavy as it otherwise would. I think of visiting the Indiana Penitentiary before I go home so as I can see how they do up things compared with our prison. It is only across the river at Jeffersonville.

The Sons had a big time here on last Thursday night dedicating a New Hall. Quite a number of Divisions were represented and the Daughters were out in Regalia and a new Society of Boys in uniform also and they looked finely. I am surprised to hear Gov has not appointed Deputies for Columbus, as I supposed every thing was fixed long ago. I shall stop a couple of days in Cincinnati on my return. Yours &c J. P. Greenier
