Partnersburg Va Jan^y 12th 1848

Dear Bro

Many year have elapsed since I
saw you in Baltimore, it was in light st.
meeting house, at the time the "Sainted Summerfield"
was there, I recollect you very well, and
am acquainted with your character, and when
Bro B. V. Spahr (our Station^d Preacher) told
me that you was living in Columbus, I at
once determined to write you a few lines
and request of you the favor to hand
the enclosed letter to J. S. Condon, a convict
in the Penitentiary, he is an acquaintance
of ours, I did think a good deal of him
and feel very sorry that he is confined
on such testimony as I have been informed,
I have reason to believe he was wronged
on the trial, that there was foul play
and if there is any likelihood to get
him out of that place I shall make the
attempt, if he is not permitted to write
to me, will you be so good as to drop
me a few lines and let me know how
he is and what he is working at &c
you will look over the letter, and if
I have written any thing that is improper
you will withhold it from him and
let me know the defect and I will
write another, or you mark off what
is wrong and let him have the balance,
I do not wish to do any thing against your
rules, if the letter cannot be given to him
perhaps you can be allowed to tell him
that you got a letter from me for him so
that he may know I have not forgotten him

Brother Spahr is unwell at this time,
we had a quarterly Meeting which commenced
last Saturday and Closed last night
(Wednesday) Bro & Prcd our Elders was
with us and Laboured faithfully -
we had a good time - thank the Lord
- give -

If you see my friend V. W.
Smith watchmaker give him my
best wishes, I love the man, he
lived in our town some 5 or 6 years
