Dear Mr. Finley

Thro' Divine goodness we are all well.— Since I saw you we have been favored with some refreshings from the presence of the Lord.

Some 40, — mostly children, however, — have been received on trial, and about the same number converted.— The good Lord keeps them faithful, & add to them such as shall be saved.— Amen.

I wish to be informed, — first, of the result of your conference with Col. Dewey, respecting the probability of my brother in law being employed as a guard in the Penitentiary — and, secondly, on what 2 sabbaths you wish Mr. Boine & myself to serve your charge — in order that we may make our arrangements to the best advantage —

Forasmuch as, in accordance with our usages, Mr. Swormstedt will vacate his place in the Books Agency, I would respectfully suggest to our delegation to nominate, and do whatever is right & proper to be done, & secure the election of Rev. Uriah Heath to that office.

I need not say to you, Mr. Finley — that Mr. Heath is every way qualified to perform the duties of that station efficiently nor need you be reminded that he has been employed for a number of years in a self sacrificing service to promote the cherished interests of the Conference & the church. I understand that Mr. Trimble is a candidate. If so —

and should he be the choice of Rev. Can. he, I doubt not, would manage the concern well - But there are other prominent places which he might fill advantageously - as the presidency of some of our Literary Institutions - to which Mr. Heath would never aspire - and I think - and I am not alone in thinking - that, all things considered, if the Ohio Conference furnish the man - Mr. Heath is the man to be supported for the office -

N.B. In justice to Mr. Heath I ought to say that I have not exchanged a word with him upon the subject - nor has any one else to my knowledge.

May the good Lord direct us all in the good and right way -
