Carthage Ohio January 21st 1849

Dear brother Gendly. I take this opportunity to write a few lines to you, to inform you of my misfortune and troubles an account of my son being convicted of Burglary, being found in the cellar of a smoke house but from which nothing was taken, when ~~he~~ was very drunk, or as one witness says crazy, but that witness could not be had on the trial but I now have the affidavit of that witness and likewise the affidavits of others, some members of the methodist church to prove his former character. I have been a member myself for forty four years in good standing in the church. now my request is that you will go and see my son John Gossett, and converse with him on religion and ascertain whether ^{there} has been any reformation in him since he has been there, and what has been his general conduct. ~~some~~ brother Adam N. Piddle thinks that a statement from you if his conduct has been good will be of great service towards getting him release from confinement. brother I wish you would see my son as often as you can and pray with and for him, and I want you to send me an answer as soon as you can how his mind is on the subject of religion and what his general conduct has been — no more at present but remain your sister in the church till death
