Dear Bro

I am very sorry I have not the opportunity to be with ^{you} at some times but we must take things as they are - I have very poor health at this time I have a deep cold settled on my lungs the rest of my family is all tolerable well I was at Columbus last Oct & at the Penitentiary I saw there what I long predicted that Mc would rule either with whigs or Locos I find Matty is head cook of the yard some of the boys undertook to find fault with you for leaving when you did I shewed them it was false & a man that had done as much for those guards as you had merited ungrateful I had an act sent to me from the Christian Advocate & Journal in it was an error that is prior to January 1848 I was in debt ~~the~~ \$1-00 & in the latter part of February 1848 I pd you \$3-00 it being the diff. to 49 you gave me a receipt in the bell house I said you would not send it on until ^{you} I suppose it had slipped your memory as I so stated in reply to Bond & Scott This is a poor place for religious societies I all most spiritly to you here let me hear from you
