Father Smiley:

Sir: Your kind favor of - desc. came to my box, when at home & since my return I have delayed until I could know, the probability of the Report of Wardens & Directors of C. Penitentiary. I have had a familiar talk with your friend Col. Ducey, the worthy Warden & he informs me that both himself & the Directors make a flattering reference to your valuable services, in the discharge of your Heavenly duties there - of the fact you must be pleased especially of some of our Reverend & Christian friends (God save the mark) about & about the state there, have sought to do you great injustice in this matter - History will not lie and falsify if individuals do -

Col. Ducey writes to be remembered to you & makes a request to have from you a copy of your new publication - It would be of great service to the Pen. Committee -

Our mutual friend Oley was pleased to hear from you & hereby sends his unchanged love & respect - He says so soon as you can get your books out, you better come up with a few hundred copies & we will help you along with the sale - I think Col. Ducey wants you to pay him a visit - when can you come? Write me soon we are at work now - Yours Truly Geo. M. Smith
