Mr & Clash dear sir

I was glad to find this morning your excellent paper
on my table - and in looking over it I found this question
Profounded Whase, were the "Lorzy," on Thursday of the
County temperance Convention, I answer sick at my room
with a palpitation of heart from over working; and could
not be there without great impudence; I wish it to be
perfectly understood that I do not speak to any man in this
as being a whole soul temperance man up to the mark
but hub and all; before any other man in this
that I have any knowledge of I commenced a publick
war with this curse of our race; and in 1811 & 1812
in the County of Fairfield - Middlington & Litching
~~Counties~~ I pledged more then 15 hundred to the
the total pledge; and for more then 42 years I have

enemy of this greatest of all curses; test the
people of of this community that I live to note;
and will live to help to destroy this enemy of
