Martinsburg Knox Co. Ohio Jan 16th 1846
Dear Brother

With some diffidence I address you at this time, having no personal acquaintance with you, but the present circumstances I hope will be a sufficient apology.

You are well aware of the difficulties that have agitated the church in some of the slave holding conferences; and the awkward position, of some of the members, and preachers, especially in Missouri, many of the preachers having to leave in consequence of the decision of that conf. and that too because they could not ^{not} go ~~con~~concienciously with the South, and I among the number of those who were found to adhere to the Methodist E. Church. I am now upon the border of your work, and at your disposal; if you have any vacancy in the bounds of your District; or if any of the other Presiding Elders should need me, I shall willingly go in the strength of him who called me to the work of the Ministry; as I am not known to you, I will here send you a copy of my certificate obtained from the Secretary of Mo. Conf.

To all whom it may concern, Rev Joseph Reece having given notice of his intention to go with the North, this is to certify that he is a deacon of the M. E. Church in

good standing, and ^{that} after having traveled two years on trial, his character was approved by the Missouri conference at its ~~last~~ late session in Columbia Mo, though he being not present was not admitted into full connection. By order of the conference.
